Programs are 6 weeks to 6 months long. Some run every other day, others are Semestered. Each has it's own unique set of essential skills required for success and acceptance (eg Academic & Practical Skills)

TRAIN in TRADES programs are provided through a funding arrangement with the Industry Training Authority, a BC Provincial Government Crown agency.

WHAT IS TRAIN in TRADES

“Train in Trades” is the technical training component of an industry training program (apprenticeship) for secondary school students. Training is done in the classroom and shop to complete Level 1. About 20% of an apprenticeship path is technical training, the other 80% is on the job or work based training.

HOW DOES A STUDENT BENEFIT FROM THE TRAIN in TRADES PROGRAM?

- Head start on a career in the skilled trades.
- Registration as an apprentice with the ITA (Industry Training Authority).
- Elective graduation credits.
- Post-secondary Dual Credit registration at programs offered at BCIT, Kwantlen, and VCC
- Tuition is paid for by the school district.

TRAIN in TRADES PROGRAM

HOW DO STUDENTS APPLY?

- Contact your Secondary School Career staff, Counsellor or Apprenticeship Facilitator.
- Check you have the needed essential skills
- Discuss the program with your family.
- Attend a site visit & info session.
- Submit a completed application package by Spring Break of the preceding school year for consideration.

WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT?

Students receive credit for ITA Level 1 of technical training and also receive secondary school graduation credits. A minimum of 70% is required for ITA credits.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR WORK EXPERIENCE IN A TRAIN in TRADES PROGRAM? 120 hours of work-based training is part of some TRAIN in TRADES programs. Through Work Experience (WEX) students can gain unpaid on-the-job experience in the workplace. Four graduation credits can be earned for each 120 hours worked.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR A TRAIN in TRADES PROGRAM?

Students must be enrolled in a Delta District Secondary School, over the age of 16 to start and under the age of 20 when the program is completed. Students applying in Grade 12 must complete their transition plan prior to Grad .

PROGRAM COSTS

Tuition (\$500 to \$3500) is paid by the school district. All other costs (\$200 to \$1100) are the responsibility of the parent/guardian/student. These other costs may include textbooks, safety gear, transportation , and tools. Each TRAIN in TRADES Program is different.

WHAT IS WORK in TRADES?

WORK in TRADES is the work-based training (WBT) part of an apprenticeship also available to secondary school students. Students need to be hired and working under a journey person with WorkSafe.

Students can add ‘WORK’ in TRADES to their ‘TRAIN’ in TRADES program, or start with Work and add Training. Either can be done separately. See our website and the Work in Trades brochure for further information.
